Dear friends, let us keep reminding ourselves that our church is not a building; it is us. The Eucharist is not only a sacrament that we celebrate in a liturgical way; it is us united by and in the Spirit of Christ. Firstly, as it becomes even more difficult to physically interact with others, can I invite you to please use whatever means possible to maintain and even increase contact with one another in our parish. Many of us are blessed with good family and social connections, but not everyone is guite so fortunate. And so, can I encourage us all to watch out for those who may already have become quite isolated, lonely or feeling forgotten? And if you feel you are one of these people, can I encourage you to consider picking up the phone and making your need known to someone you trust? As a response to this need, I would like to invite parishioners who are willing to be part of a Phone Circle to contact me or the parish office. We are aiming to form a group of parishioners who can offer the ministry of simple contact by making a few calls each week to those who may just need a chat or a gentle enquiry about their welfare. Once we have these people, I will invite you to let us know (with their consent) of any people in our area who would welcome a regular call.

Secondly, I would like to invite any parishioners who may be interested to form smallish online groups. The purpose of these may be, for example, to pray together in a way of their choosing, or to share reflections about the upcoming Sunday Scripture readings, or to discuss some issue of interest (particularly related to faith or spirituality), or simply to check in on how they are dealing with the current situation, and so on. My reason for suggesting this is that the present situation can actually be an opportunity for us to experiment, to try something new, to not only maintain connection with one another, but to enhance it. One way is to use a computer program such as Zoom to meet one another over the internet. If you do not know what this is or how to use it, but you have computer and internet access, I and the parish office will happily assist you.

## **PLANNED GIVING**

# SCRÍPtural Conterxi **Passion narratives**

Towards the end of the 19th Century, the German scholar, Martin Kähler, described the gospels as 'passion narratives with lengthy introductions'. Over time, this description was more commonly applied to the gospel of Mark, but it is quite true of all four gospels. The passion elements are the climax of each gospel narrative and were probably written first to establish the unique interpretation of each of the gospel communities. The remainder of the gospel was written to 'set the scene' for the culmination of the message in the passion. Reading the four accounts of the passion reveal the unique styles and themes of the different gospel writers.
