Reflection

One Sunday a pastor told the congregation that the church needed some extra money and asked the people to prayerfully consider giving a little extra in the offering plate. He said that whoever gave the most would be able to pick out three hymns. After the offering plates were passed, the pastor glanced down and noticed that someone had placed a \$1000 cheque on the plate.

He was so excited that he immediately shared his joy with his congregation and said he'd like to personally thank the person who placed the money in the plate.

A very quiet, elderly, saintly spinster at the back shyly raised her hand. The pastor asked her to come to the front. Slowly she made her way to the altar. He told her how wonderful it was that she gave so much and, in thanksgiving, asked her to pick out three hymns.

Her eyes brightened as she looked over the congregation, pointed to the three most handsome men in the congregation and said, 'OK Father, I'll take him, him, and him.' Now that's a different take on a wise virgin!

In one sense the parable of the wise and foolish virgins could be considered the first known oil crisis in the east. It is, however, about planning for the future and pacing oneself to see that one has a future to enjoy.

In Christian theology this is called 'discernment'. St Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, wrote a lot about discernment and one of his teachings is that the Holy Spirit allows us to prepare for our future without living it.

Think for a moment of the times when we are going to have a difficult interview or a conversation we would rather not have. We play out in our mind how the interaction will run. It rarely happens how we imagine and we find that our anxiety and fear has often been misplaced. What is curious is that on the next occasion we go through this same process of trying to live the future all over again. Tragically, some people are so anxious about their future that they try and control it, and everyone associated with it. It's always a disaster.

St Ignatius was suspicious of this process. Ignatius seems to have understood today's Gospel very well. The early church thought Jesus would return quickly. There was a crisis of faith when he didn't. Some Christians lived as though this imminent return was a fact. We are still waiting. Matthew tells us then, that the Christian life is about wisdom, right judgment and reading the signs of the times.

St Ignatius tells us the best way to prepare for the future is to let go of the unhealed past, as best as we can, and live in the here and now. The Holy Spirit helps us see what needs to be done today and what preparation is necessary for tomorrow. This is such simple and sound advice and yet many of us don't heed it. For some of us it takes nothing to feel the hurt and pain of our past or to be consumed by the future.

Alcoholics Anonymous sums it up neatly when it tells us to take life 'one day at a time' which is another way of saying what Matthew's community came to see, 'keep awake because you know not the time or place'.

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary (17th November)

PATRON OF THE SECULAR FRANCISCAN ORDER "IT IS CHRIST WHOM YOU HAVE WASHED, FED AND LOOKED AFTER"

The spiritual fire of Saint Francis burst out where ever the friars went, this was especially so in life of the



beautiful Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. When the friars Minor came to Thuringia in 1222 her and her husband, Ludwig were very much impressed with their way of life. Elizabeth chose Friar Rudiger as her spiritual director. When he narrated to her the circumstances of the conversion of the young and rich merchant Francis of Assisi, Elizabeth was even more enthusiastic about following her path of Christian life. From that moment, she decided to follow even more closely the poor and crucified Christ, present in the poor by joining the third Order of Saint Francis, today called the Secular Franciscans. Even when her first son was born, followed by two others, our saint never neglected her works of charity towards those who suffered. Moreover, she helped the Friars Minor to build a monastery in Halberstadt, of which Friar Rudiger became the superior. Elizabeth's spiritual direction then passed to Konrad of Marburg. Her practical love of God shone out in her joyous love of her husband and family and her constant steadfast love for the poor, sick and helpless. Her ability to clearly organize her priorities made her one of the most famous women of Europe and an ideal for all those in positions of responsibility to follow.

Laudato Si

The Recent XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops had a commitment to the safeguarding of creation prior to its assembly. Through the financial support of SOS Planet Foundation and the technical contribution of LifeGate (already tested at the 2019 Synod) part of the remaining CO2 emissions will be offset thanks to projects that generate a carbon credit. The project chosen to compensate emissions, which responds to the criterion of integral ecology as proposed by the encyclical Laudato Si', brings together the ecological aspect, attention to the local area and concrete help for the lives of populations involved. The identified project, implemented in Nigeria and Kenya, aims to disseminate efficient cooking stoves and water purification technologies to households, communities and institutions. This will result in a significant improvement in air pollution that is directly correlated to respiratory disease and mortality rates, especially among women and children.
