Reflection ...

Seeing today's Gospel is set by the water's edge, this story seems appropriate.

One day, three men were hiking and unexpectedly came upon a large raging river. They needed to get to the other side, but had no idea of how to do so. The first man prayed to God, 'Please God, give me the strength to cross this river.' In an instant God gave him big arms and strong legs, and he was able to swim across the river in about two hours, after almost drowning a couple of times.

Seeing this, the second man prayed to God, 'Please God, give me the strength and the resources to cross this river.' In an instant God gave him a rowboat and he was able to row across the river in about an hour, after almost capsizing the boat a couple of times.

The third man had seen how this worked out for the other two, so he also prayed to God saying, 'Please God, give me the strength and the resources ... and the intelligence ... to cross this river.' In an instant God turned him into a woman. She looked at the map, went upstream a couple of hundred metres, then walked across the bridge!

The three men's prayers were all about gaining something: strength, resources and intelligence. Today's readings are about gaining things too. Unlike the instant answer to the hikers' prayers, Jonah, Paul and Mark know real gain usually comes less dramatically and quickly, and involves letting go of something as much as it involves taking it on. In the Christian life this is called conversion, and it's at the centre of our life of faith.

Christian conversion is not a once-in-a-lifetime moment. It can happen every day in a rich variety of ways. It involves a change in attitude as much as a change in life-style.

All three readings show a different facet of conversion. Jonah calls the Ninevites to social conversion. St Paul, who reveals a very strong expectation that the end of time is near, calls the people of Corinth to a conversion of mind. And through relating the call of Simon, Andrew, James and John, St Mark tells us about personal conversion.

These days we regularly hear God's call in personal terms. It's sometimes called 'me and God' theology. Modern hymns reflect it best. We regularly sing about how Jesus died 'for me', or that 'here I am Lord' or that 'I will follow you'. Individually these lines are all true, the problem is that they tend to play down the more ancient and biblical social dimensions of our call to conversion. In the Bible even though God and Jesus call people to conversion through personal relationships, there is no hint that this is where it stops. Every call leads to the wider community, to the people of Israel in the Old Testament, and out to the entire world in the New Testament.

Today's readings provide a litmus test for our conversion. If our faith has become a self-help club, where we talk about 'my' God, 'my' prayers, 'my' Church, 'my' Mass, we are in need of conversion. We don't need to leave God's personal love for us behind, we just need to see it as a necessary preparation for belonging to the people of God as we engage with the world at every level. We are challenged to reject the idea that it's me-and-God-against-the-world, and welcome in the idea that it's *us* -and-God-*in*-the-world.

May this Eucharist give us the strength, resources and intelligence we need to be converted personally and socially again this Sunday.

Laudato Si

While the World Economic Forum talks in Davos have as their motto "rebuilding trust" (in the economy) some Dioceses in the USA have acted based on the teaching in Laudato Si' - that "everything is connected" (by love and God is love). The Archdiocese of Chicago's Cardinal Blaise Cupich announced that it has shifted its nearly 400 parishes and schools and offices electricity purchase to 100% renewables: https://www.archchicago.org/news-release/-/article/2023/12/17/archdiocese-of -chicago-announces-its-shift-to-100-renewable-energyThe Archdiocese of San Diego is the first US diocese to divest from climate-harming companies and not without pushback (and approval) from within and outside the church. Sacramental Coordinator

Our Parish is part of the Catholic Archdiocese of Brisbane staffed by the Franciscan Friars of the Holy Spirit Province. We aim to be a prayerful, caring community in the spirit of St Francis, so that we may come to know more intensely the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We are seeking an enthusiastic and committed person to coordinate the sacramental program where children and families can encounter Christ, be transformed by Him, and realise their call to discipleship. This is a casual position (approximately 10 hours a week) with flexible hours.

Main Purpose

The Sacramental Program Coordinator assists the parish priest in the organisation and delivery of the parish sacramental program and other liturgical ministries. The Coordinator will prepare and deliver information sessions, learning resources and liturgy materials for the sacraments of Confirmation, First Communion and Reconciliation.

Duties

Co-ordinate sacramental enrolment:

Liaise with the Parish Team & APRE at St Anthony's School.

Enlist the practical help of volunteers

Prepare all enrolment material.

Advertise in school, parish, web newsletters – as well as at all local state schools; and promote sacramental program on Facebook and parish website.

Send enrolment information to all Catholic families in Yr 3, Yr 4 & Yr 5.

Liaise with parents and attend to day-to-day sacramental queries. Issues of a pastoral nature are to be discussed, as appropriate, with the Parish Priest or school staff.

Order sacramental materials i.e. booklets, stationery, medals, certificates etc. Prepare and print certificates and celebration booklets for each sacrament. Prepare sacramental celebrations/Masses in liaison with the Parish Priest, office manager and volunteers.

Prepare PowerPoint slideshows for sacramental celebrations

Maintain Sacrament data base on PACS

Prepare, organise and deliver materials for Parent Preparation Sessions

Prepare, organise and deliver materials for Family Workshops Prepare, organise and deliver materials for Confirmation and First Eucharist retreats

Coordinate volunteers to assist in the celebration of the Sacraments and organise celebration afterwards

Attend training where relevant.

Attend at all sacrament celebrations, including weekend Masses if applicable.

The successful applicant should be able to demonstrate

- An understanding of parish life, liturgy, and the sacraments.
- An understanding of and commitment to the Mission and Vision of the Catholic Church.
- Knowledge and experience in a Catholic context including integrating children and families into the broader church community.
- A demonstrated capacity to work both independently and with others in a team environment.

• Demonstrated leadership abilities and experience in group facilitation and delivery of learning materials.

Highly developed organizational skills and interpersonal communication skills.

• Computer skills – basic knowledge and experience in the Microsoft Office and management of email communication lists and platforms.

• Must have a Qld suitability card for child related employment (Blue Card) or willing to obtain.

Must have Police check or willing to obtain.
