4th Sunday of Lent –10th March 2024 (YEAR B)



This weekend Kedron Parish would like to welcome newly ordained Rev Peter Doherty. Peter had been a significant part of Kedron Parish, and we are thrilled to have him back this weekend. We urge you to join us in welcoming him back to our community. Let's show him how much we value his presence and support him in his new role with confidence and pride.

Reflection...

As Christians in the world we cannot help but be influenced by the developments that happen around us. Indeed, we believe that many of these advances are gifts from God, given to us to enjoy. But not all developments in thinking and practices are for the better.

One recent and alarming development is the false thinking that we cannot judge other people, or that we should not be judged. The wider community regularly maintains that no one is in a position to judge another's behaviour or statements. This approach holds that everyone's words and actions are of equal value. This position is many things, but it's certainly not Christian, but this hasn't stopped it from finding a home amongst us. We regularly hear statements from Christian men and women like, 'We're not in a position to judge' or 'You can't judge them' and 'If it's fine for them, then it's fine'. This thinking has a name. It's called moral relativism and it tries to claim that the morality of behaviour is only determined by the person who does the act, or the context within which the action is taken.

Our Catholic tradition teaches us that a context is very important in trying to work out if someone is to blame for what they say and do, but that a person's particular circumstances never change the fact that the words or actions are in themselves wrong. We hold that while all human beings have equal value and dignity, we do not believe that everyone's opinion and actions are of equal worth. We believe that 'right judgment' is a gift of the Holy Spirit and that it's best exercised with humility and compassion.

When I hear people say I should not judge others, I assume they are telling me that I should not condemn other people. There is a world of difference between judging and condemning. To judge is to make an assessment. To condemn is to damn. As Christians we judge because we have to keep discerning how the things of the world can be reconciled with the things we hold to be true. Condemnation is the prerogative of God alone, who sees all, knows all and loves all. In today's Gospel, however, John tells us that even God has forfeited the right to condemn the world, but has sent Jesus to be the world's light, life, truth and saviour.

The Gospel reminds us that if we feel condemned for what we have done and said, then it's because we have condemned ourselves, not because God condemns us. John tells us that even when we find ourselves lost in the darkness of our most destructive behaviour, the saving love of Christ is always available to us, inviting us to come out of the darkness into his light.

What a great metaphor the light and dark is for making the best judgments in our own lives. Alarm bells should always ring when we find ourselves not wanting anyone else to know what we have said or done. Secrecy is often the ally of sin and the more open and transparent we are, the more confident we can be that we are walking as children of the light.

May this Lenten Eucharist enable us to let go of the desire to condemn others and ourselves, and to receive again the compassionate, just and humble gift of right judgment that helps us to see the darkness for what it is, and keeps us walking in the light of Christ.

Communion for the Cup



We are pleased to announce that starting Palm Sunday, 'Communion from the Cup' will be reinstated across the Parish, making the Precious Blood available at all weekend and weekday Masses. It is up to each individual to decide whether to receive from the cup or not. We strongly urge Communion Ministers to contact the Parish Office if they

have any concerns about consuming what remains after communion. We will be offering two cups at each Mass, with only a small amount of wine put out. Our preference is that the cup runs out by the end of communion, so that no Precious Blood is left. It is important to remember that Jesus Christ is 'whole and entire' under both the form of bread and under the form of wine. We can choose to consume the Host, or the Host and Precious Blood. Regardless of our choice, we will still receive the body, blood, soul, and divinity of our Lord.

World Day of Prayer:

Last Friday, close to 100 people from local faith communities shared an ecumenical prayer service in our parish church. Each year, the service is prepared by the women of a particular country and for 2024 the focus was Palestine. The opportunity to hear the prayers and stories of Palestinian women was particularly poignant as we see in the daily news the terrible war they are enduring. We had the chance to pray with and for these people as they are beset by the horrors of war and gain some insight into their faith and their country of birth, the land where Jesus also trod.

Thank you to Mary Anne Lucas and Marie Jones who led the service as our parish representatives and also organised an amazing morning tea that gave all attendees the chance to gather and share their thoughts on what was a very moving ser-



Laudato Si

This last week, the Archdiocese of Brisbane launched its 2024 – 2026 Laudato Si' Action Plan –LSAP (see their website) It provides for actions to be led by a particular person or team in the Archdiocese who is responsible for their timing and reporting on details of implementation by way of accountability. For instance, one goal is the "planting of native trees and vegetation will be encouraged on all Archdiocesan property and guidelines and advice will be developed". God already managed with the co-operation of some of his birds (one big one too) to drop seeds and grow "volunteer" native trees on our beautiful Church property. 
