The Ecumenical celebration of the Season of Creation begins 1st September and concludes on October 4th, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi. This year we celebrate eight centuries of praying St Francis' prayer, The Canticle of Creation. 2025 also marks a Jubilee Year in our Catholic Church, a time for rest, reflection and renewal of our faith journey.

The Care for creation Group at Our Lady, Queen of Apostles, Stafford planned a series of prayerful and practical actions, for each week of the Season of Creation. The culmination of which was a special event to celebrate this St Francis' Feast Day and reaffirm our commitment to 'ecological conversion' (LS 217). Joining with the other Christian Churches in our area, we made a Pilgrimage of Hope.

The Pilgrimage of Hope was jointly planned by Our Lady, Queen of Apostles, St Clements on the Hill Anglican Church and St Paul's Uniting Church in Stafford, along with Delamore Retirement Community and Little Flower Catholic Church in Kedron.

The focus was hope- hope that a different future is possible; faith in God's abiding presence in all that is, and love for the community of creation.

We know that there are many issues of concern in our world, society and churches. Basic to all is the urgency of holding to a vision of a world where there is respect, reverence and care for the whole community of creation, of which we are part.

Fifty pilgrims from suburbs across Brisbane participated in the five-kilometre journey, which took in the leafy surrounds, and the many the rises and dips of the Stafford/Kedron landscape. Most of the participants were strangers to each other; what united us was our commitment to follow in the footsteps of Jesus, who taught us to care for one another and for all that is created by His Father. The pace was gentle, the conversation rich. At each of the five Christian Community locations, we took time to rest, pray and reflect on the wonder of Creation.

Gathering on the lawn at Stafford Catholic Parish, we commenced our journey by taking time to acknowledge the sacred and holy land which we share. We turned to each point of the compass and prayed for the Spirit of Truth, Fortitude, Love and Beauty to surround us and empower us to live as Jesus taught us. We acknowledged the Traditional Owners of our land, recognising their kinship with the earth, recognising their wisdom and the millions of footsteps they have walked on this land. With hope in our heart and a excited for adventure, we set out.

St Clements on the Hill, Anglican Community shared with us a reading from Proverbs 8:22-31 in which we learned that Wisdom precludes all creation. The church sits proudly on a hill, surrounded by historic gums, original to the landscape of Stafford. St Clements parishioners this year have responded to the call for supporting biodiversity in nature, by planting a butterfly garden. This picturesque place of tranquillity, will be a sanctuary for not only butterflies, but all creatures.

An uphill walk to St Pauls Uniting Church, we were warmly welcomed by Rev Annie Baker; cold water on hand and in the filtered light of the beautiful church, we were grateful for a comfortable seat and chance to refresh. Once settled, Rev Annie offered a meditation on Genesis 1:1-31 complimented by stunning visuals of the Creation Story.

Leaving St Pauls, we walked on to the Delamore Retirement Community, which resides in the grounds of the old convent of Franciscan Missionary Sisters. The pilgrims gathered under the shade of a huge ficus tree, which cast shadows over the grand old home, Delamore and her historic round drive way, where a statue of Our Lady, graciously welcomes visitors. At Delamore, we reflected on the gift of living life to the full, using our talents for the glory of God and drawing on His Wisdom to enable a fruitful journey.

A short walk from Delamore took us to the Little Flower Catholic Church, Kedron. Here Fr Joseph explained the history of this parish and its deep connection with the Franciscan Friars. We shared a prayer Peace with Creation, where we acknowledged our destructive impulses and prayed to come together as one family to labour for peace. Fr Joesph introduced us to the art of Dianne Minnar, who painted a series of seven timber panels inspired by the Season of Creation. The artworks are her visual interpretation of Genesis 1, offering a glimpse into the magnificence, wonder and order of God's creation.

At Kedron Catholic Parish, the pilgrims enjoyed the opportunity to relax with refreshments. Many new connections were established as conversation bubbled.

Nourished and refreshed, we set off from Kedron, enjoying the downhill run, to Our Lady, Queen of Apos-

tles, where the pilgrims concluded a fabulous journey by praying St Francis beautiful poem, The Canticle of Creatures.

Fifty pilgrims, who five hours earlier were unknown to each other, left Stafford richer for their newly made connections, nourished in body, mind and spirit.





Days Of Creation

It is the artist's hope is that these artworks will invite you to enter that "thin space" where heaven and earth seem to meet - a place where we can hold onto the hope of a renewed

world, even as we reflect on the one that we inhabit today.

Dianne works from her hilltop studio in Cedar Creek. Her award-winning artworks are included in numerous private and corporate collections worldwide.



St Francis Icons

Between September 2019 and March 2020, devastating bushfires swept across Australia, consuming more than 46 million acres in New South Wales and the Northern Territory. The destruction of habitat and the immeasurable loss of wildlife left the artist deeply grieved. Out of this sorrow arose a prayerful response — a series of icons depicting St Francis of Assisi in communion with Australia's native birds.

In these works, St Francis cradles a kookaburra, converses with an azure kingfisher, and kneels among king parrots. The birds, radiant in their resilience, become symbols of creation's enduring beauty. Through the saint's gestures of compassion and reverence, the icons hold space for lament and for hope — a vision of healing for the land and for all vulnerable creatures.



For women like Sharon, who must choose between feeding their children or selling their crops to survive, and Grace, who risked her life traveling 160km for safe childbirth, hope comes through Sr Jane and Kayula. Through sustainable farming, Sr Jane helps women provide for their families. At the Chilonga Mission Hospital, Kayula ensures mothers and babies receive the dignity and care they deserve.
